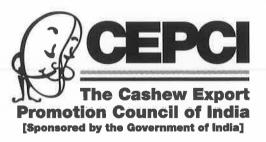

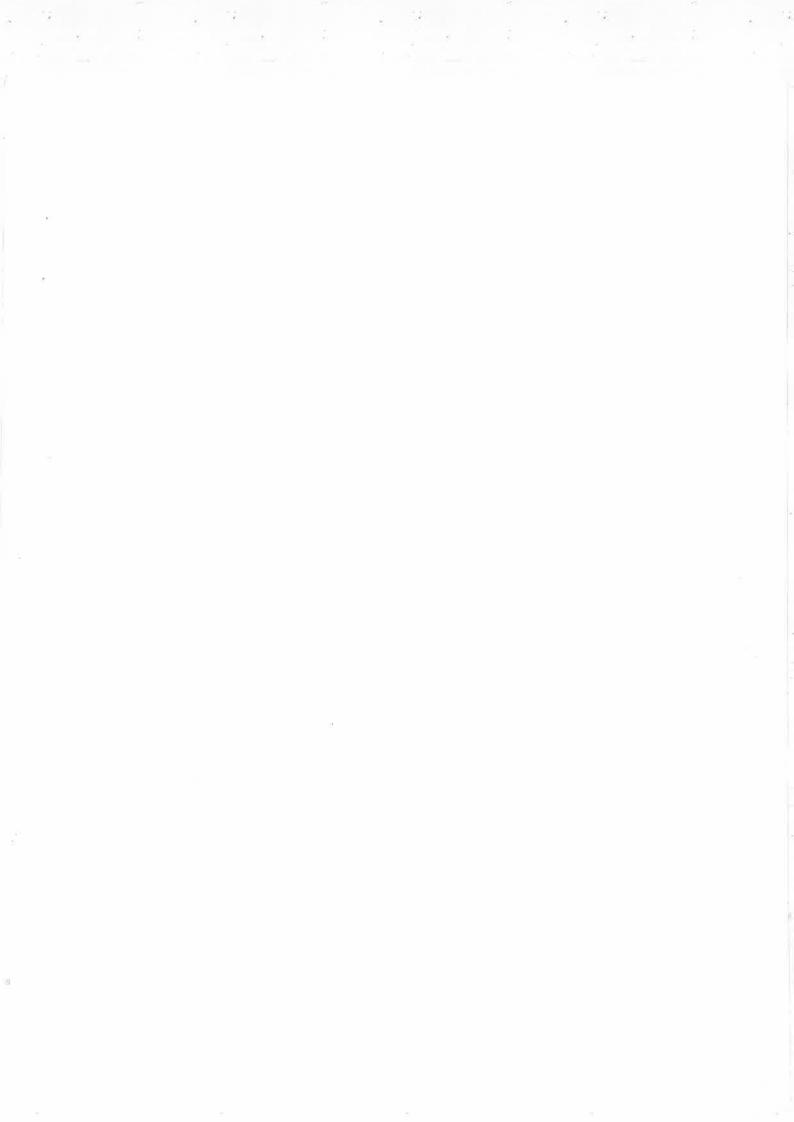

HIGHLIGHTS

- The export earnings from cashew and allied products during the year 2013-2014 were Rs. 5097.34 Cr. (US \$ 843 Mln).
- According to the data received from DGCI&S, Kolkata compiled by the Council, the export of cashew kernels during 2013-2014 was 1,14,791 MT valued at Rs. 5058.73 Cr. (US \$ 836 Mln.) as against 1,00,105 MT valued at Rs. 4046.23 Cr. (US \$ 747 Mln.) exported during 2012-13.
- The export of cashew nut shell liquid from India during 2013-14 was 9,480 MT valued at Rs. 38.61 Cr. (US \$ 6 Mln). The export of cashew nut shell liquid during 2012-13 was 9,192 MT valued at Rs. 29.84Cr. (US \$ 6 Mln).
- ➤ The total membership in the Council as on 31-3-2014 was 273 including associate members.
- The Council successfully organized international Buyer Seller meet 'Kaju India 2013' at Kollam on 26 & 27 September 2013. About 250 delegates (including 26 foreign delegates) attended the programme.
- During 2013-14, the Council participated in 5 international exhibitions and attended three International Conferences. Council also organized one reverse BSM at Kollam and two BSMs abroad.
- Council sponsored the Cashew Satellite Meeting of the INC Annual Congress 2013.
- ➤ Council initiated the industry sponsored project study on the subject "Effect of cashew nut supplementation on glycemic status and lipid profile in type 2 diabetic subjects" supported by the Govt. of India at the Department of Foods Nutrition & Dietetics Research, Madras Diabetes Research Foundation, Chennai.
- A sum of Rs 30.75 lakhs was reimbursed to 40 member exporters for participation in international fairs, trade delegations; etc. under the Market Development Assistance of the Govt. of India during 2013-14.
- A sum of Rs. 2.07 Crore was released to 29 member exporters as grant-in-aid under the Five Year Plan Schemes of the Govt. of India.
- ➤ The Council received 112 Trade Enquiries at its office during 2013-14 which were circulated among Council members.
- ➤ The CEPC Laboratory & Technical Division, Kollam analyzed 5773 samples during 2013-14.





REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF ADMINISTRATION ON THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COMMITTEE AND ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2014

I. EXPORT PERFORMANCE

- As per the export-import statistics published by the DGCI&S, Kolkatta, the share of agricultural products in the total export earnings of the country during 2013-14 (April 2013 to March 2014) is 7,33% and cashew kernels ranked 8th among them contributing 3.67% of the agri product exports. This accounted to 0.27% of the total foreign exchange earnings of the country through exports.
- According to DGCI&S figures, the total export of cashew kernels from India during 2013-14 was 1,14,791 M.T. valued at Rs. 5058.73 Cr. (US \$ 836 Mln). There has been an increase of 14.67 % in quantity, 25.02% in value in Rupee terms and a 11.91% in US \$ terms in comparison with the export of 1,00,105 M.T. cashew kernels valued at Rs. 4046.23 Cr. (US \$ 747 Mln) during 2012–2013.
- 1.3 Cashew Kernels exports during 2013-14 is an all time record in terms of value in Rupee and crossed Rs. 5000 Cr. during the year.
- The export of Cashew Nut Shell Liquid / Cardanol from India during April to March-2014 was 9,480 M.T valued at Rs. 38.61 Cr. (US \$ 6 Mln.). There was an increase of 3.13% in quantity, 29.39% in value in Rupee terms and 9% in US \$ terms compared to the export of 9,192 MT of Cashew Nut Shell Liquid valued at Rs. 29.84 Cr. (US \$ 5.51 Mln.) during 2012-2013.



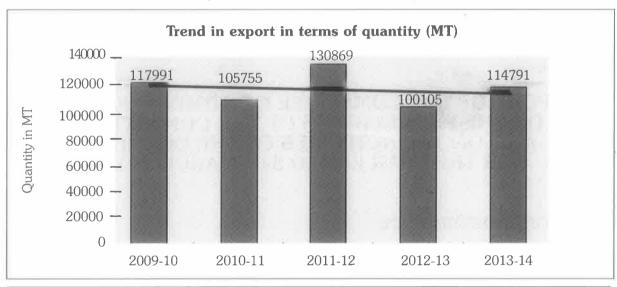

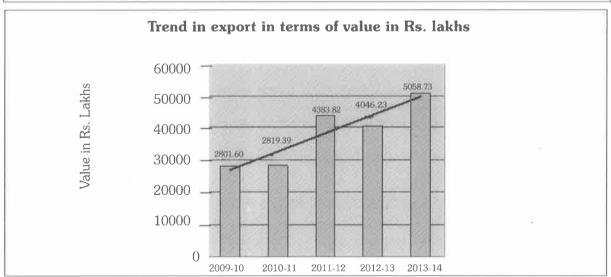

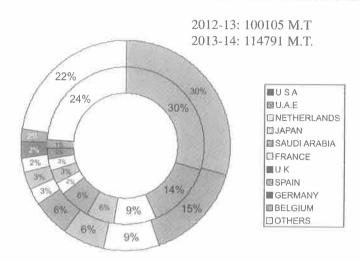

Outside segment based on 2013-14, inside on 2012-13, growth is 14.67%

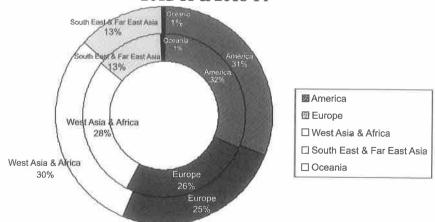
2.2. Major Markets for cashew kernels

2.2.1. The major markets for Indian cashew kernels during 2013-2014 were USA, U.A.E, The Netherlands, Saudi Arabia, Japan, Spain, France, UK, Germany, Korea Rep., Belgium, etc.. Among our major markets, considerable increase was noted in the exports to Korea Rep.(81.31%). Other markets recorded more than 20 % increases were UAE, Saudi Arabia, Spain, Kuwait, Iran, etc.. On the other hand, exports to Russia, one of our major traditional markets (which was lost to Vietnam during the short ban in 2008) decreased considerably to 42.97%. Exports to Egypt, Malaysia, Thailand, Jordan, etc. also recorded a decrease compared to 2012-13.

2.3. Export of cashew kernels to different zones:

2.3.1. Out of the total quantity of cashew kernels exported during 2013-2014, 30.79% were to American Zone. European Zone accounted for 25.39%, West Asian Zone for 27.91%, South East & Far East Asian Zone for 12.75%, Oceanic Zone for 0.60% and African Zone for 2.54%.

3. EXPORT OF CASHEW NUT SHELL LIQUID & CARDANOL

3.1. The export of Cashew Nut Shell Liquid / Cardanol from India during 2013-2014 was 9,480 MT valued at Rs. 38.61 Cr. as against 9,192 MT valued at Rs. 29.84 Cr. during 2012-2013.

The major markets for CNSL were USA, China, Korea Rep., Slovenia, Japan, etc.

There has been a fall in our exports of CNSL/Cardanol to USA over these years. Cardolite Corporation, USA one of the major buyer of CNSL/Cardanol have now set up their unit in Karnataka, India, which would perhaps be a reason for the decrease in our direct exports to USA.

4. PRODUCTION OF RAW CASHEWNUTS IN INDIA

India continued to be the largest producer of raw cashew nuts in the world. The other main producing countries are Vietnam, Brazil, Tanzania, Ivory Coast, Guinea Bissau, Mozambique, and Indonesia. According to estimates by DCCD, the production of raw cashew nuts in India during 2013-2014 was 7,36,560 M.T. as against the estimated production of 7,28,474 M.T. during 2012-2013.

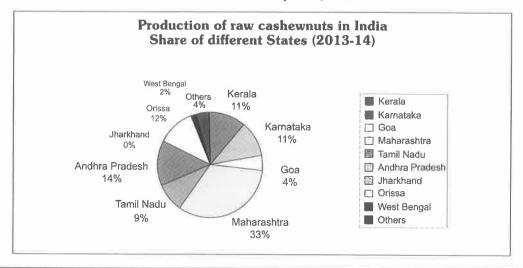

5. IMPORT OF RAW CASHEWNUTS

- The total raw cashew nuts imported into India during 2013-2014 was 7,71,356 MT valued at Rs.4563.99 Cr. and that during 2012-2013 was 892365 M.T. valued at Rs. 5331.74 Cr. The unit import price for raw cashewnut was Rs. 59.17/kg. during 2013-14 as against Rs.59.75 /kg during the previous year. (Source: DGCI&S, Kolkata.).
- 5.2. The major sources of raw cashew nut import were Ivory coast, Guinea Bissau, Tanzania., Benin, Ghana, Gambia, Senegal, Indonesia, etc.

- 6.3 Import duty for cashew kernels was fixed as per the customs notification (Notification No. 27/2013 dated on 10th May 2013). There is a duty of Rs.60 or 45% (whichever is higher), for "Cashew kernel, broken" and Rs. 75 or 45% (whichever is higher) for "Cashew Kernel, wholes" while imported into India.
- Also, as per another notification issued by DGFT (Notification No.53, (RE-2013)/2009 -2014, dated on 2nd December 2013) minimum price has been fixed for import of cashew kernels as Rs.288/- per kg for "Cashew kernel, broken" (ITC HS Code 080 13210) and Rs.400/- per kg for Cashew Kernels- wholes (ITCHS Code 080 132220).

8. EXPORT/IMPORT POLICY

8.1. Export of Cashew Kernels and Cashew Nut Shell Liquid & Cardanol

8.1.1. Export of Cashew Kernels, CNSL and Cardanol could be carried out by any person having an IE Code. Cardanol continued to be included in the list of items under Minor Forest Produce.

8.2. Import of Cashew Kernels

- 8.2.1. Cashew Kernels imported into India attracted higher Import duty from May 2013. Import duty for cashew kernels was fixed as per the customs notification (Notification No. 27/2013 dated on 10th May 2013) at Rs.60 or 45% (whichever is higher), for "Cashew kernel, broken" Rs. 75 or 45% (whichever is higher) for "Cashew Kernel, wholes".
- 8.2.2 Minimum Import Price was also notified by DGFT vide Notification No.53, (RE-2013)/2009 -2014, dated on 2nd December 2013. The minimum price has been fixed for import of cashew kernels as Rs.288/- per kg for "Cashew kernel, broken" (ITC HS Code 080 13210) and Rs.400/- per kg for Cashew Kernels-wholes (ITCHS Code 080 132220).

8.3 Import of Raw Cashewnuts

- 8.3.1 Import of raw cashewnut continued under OGL.
- 8.4. Export Incentives
- 8.4.1. The Duty drawback continued to be the same as 1% of FOB value.
- 8.4.2. VKGUY for cashew kernels, CNSL and Cardanol continued to be the same as 5% of FOB value.



8.4.3. The Council continued its efforts to get a higher rate of VKGUY for value added cashew kernels.

PRODUCTION DEVELOPMENT other Activities

- Directorate of Cashew nut & Cocoa Development under the Ministry of Agriculture and cooperation looks after the production development of cashew in the country. According to their estimates, the production of raw cashew nuts in India during 2013-14 was 7,36,560 MT as against the estimated production of 7,28,474 MT during 2012-13.
- 9.2 The Council has been representing at all relevant forums, the need for increasing the domestic production of raw cashew nuts in the country.

10. \SALES TAX / VALUE ADDED TAX / CST / SERVICE TAX

- 10.1 The Council continued to pursue with the Central / State Governments to exempt or reduce the rate of VAT for Raw Cashewnuts and cashew kernels in order to make our cashew kernels more competitive in the international markets.
- 10.2. The Council has been representing to the Govt. to exempt Cashew Council and Cashew exports from the purview of Service Tax.

11. REGISTERED OFFICE OF THE COUNCIL

11.1. The Registered Office of the Cashew EPC of India was shifted from Cochin to Cashew Bhavan, Kollam during the year, with approval of the Ministry of Commerce and the Registrar of Companies, Kerala.

12. PUBLICITY & ADVERTISEMENT

- 12.1. Council continued to publish its magazine, the monthly Cashew Bulletin and also brought out following brochures / publications during the year.
 - a. Directory of Indian Cashew Exporters
 - b. Brochures and Posters in Korean, Japanese, German & Arabic languages for participation in International fairs.

13. CONVENTIONS / EXHIBITIONS / TRADE DELEGATIONS

- 13.1. The Council participated in the 30th Anniversary World Nut & Dried Fruit Congress organized by INC at Hotel Ritz-Carlton Arts, Barcelona from 21st to 23rd May 2013 and sponsored the Cashew Satellite Meeting held on 22nd May 2013. Sixteen member exporters attended the conference and participated in the deliberations. Shri K Sasi Varma, Executive Director was the Council's official representative.
- The Council participated in ANUGA 2013 world's largest food fair held every alternate year at Cologne, Germany from 5th to 9th October 2013. Mrs. Sree Rajmohan, Joint Director organized Council's participation.
- 13.3 The Council sponsored a networking reception hosted by Association of Food Industries, USA at ANUGA on the 6th October 2013. All members of CEPCI at ANUGA got the opportunity to meet and interact with their US counterparts and stakeholders from other countries.
- The Council participated in the FOOD WEEK KOREA 2013 at the COEX Exhibition & Convention Centre, Seoul, South Korea, from 6th to 9th November 2013. Mr. K. Sasi Varma, Executive Director & Secretary was Council's official representative.
- The Council participated in the Jeddah International Trade Fair 2013 at the Jeddah Centre for Forums & Events, Jeddah, Saudi Arabia from 15-18th December 2013. Mr. R Kalyanakrishnan, Administrative Officer was the official representative.
- 13.6 The Council participated in Gulfood 2014 held at Dubai from 23rd to 27th February 2014 at Zabeel Hall, Zabeel Pavilion, Dubai International Convention & Exhibition Centre, Dubai, UAE. Mrs. Sree Rajmohan, Joint Director and Ms. Renu S. Nair, Export Promotion Executive organized Council's participation.



- Council also organized a BSM on the sidelines of Gulfood at the same venue on 24th February 2014. His Excellency, Shri T.P. Seetharam, Ambassador of India to UAE presided the meeting. About 35 members were present. Member exporters had the opportunity to network with buyers present at the Gulfood.
- 13.8 The Council participated in the 39th International Food & Beverages Exhibition Foodex 2014 Tokyo, held at Tokyo, Japan from 4-7 March 2014. Shri K Sasi Varma, Executive Director organized Council's participation.
- Report on the Council's participation in the various exhibitions and delegations along with the trade enquiries received were circulated among members for information and follow-up.

13.10. BSM - Kaju India 2013

- 13.10.1. The Council successfully organized international Buyer Seller meet 'Kaju India 2013' at 'The Hotel Raviz' on 26 & 27 September 2013. Chief Minister of Kerala Shri Oommen Chandy inaugurated the programme.
- 13.10.2 There were 20 exhibition stalls which showcased latest processing and packaging machinery, technology, quality testing process / systems etc.
- 13.10.3. There were technical sessions on Cashew: health marketing challenges and opportunities, health based marketing of nuts, effect of cashew on diabetic subjects, major markets round up (India, America, Europe, Japan), US FDA's new "foreign supplier verification program" Impact on exporters, cashew mechanisation progress in India and mechanisation in cashew processing industry.
- 13.10.4. Dr. Anup K. Pujari, DGFT, Govt. of India unveiled a plaque to mark the commencement of the first ever industry sponsored clinical study for cashew titled 'Effect of cashew nut supplementation on glycemic status & lipid profile in Type 2 diabetic subjects'
- 13.10.5. The entire spectrum of Cashew industry cashew kernel buyers, sellers, processors and providers of supporting ancillaries from India and across the world, service providers and regulator /facilitator authorities from the governments assembled for Kaju India. About 250 delegates (including 26 overseas delegates) attended the meeting.

14. ASSISTANCE FOR EXPORT PROMOTION ACTIVITIES TO EXPORTERS

14.1. Market Development Assistance (MDA) Schemes

14.1.1. A sum of Rs. 30,74,523/- was distributed to 40 member-exporters as grant towards participation in international fairs, trade delegations / BSMs during 2013-14.

14.2. Market Access Initiative (MAI) Schemes

14.2.1 The Council received approval under MAI for our Generic Promotion Scheme against which a grant amount of Rs. 4.5 crores spread over three years (2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16) would be provided for undertaking Kaju India BSM, Nutrition Study and promotion based on health benefits, Marketing and publicity, etc. The Council fully utilized Rs. 150 Lakhs which was earmarked for the year 2013-14 under the scheme.

14.3 FIVE YEAR PLAN SCHEMS

- 14.3.1. Under the XI Plan Scheme, a sum of Rs. 1.89 Crores was released to 18 member exporters as grant-in-aid for Modernization & Diversification of their processing units during 2013-14.
 - 14.3.2. The Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Department of Commerce, Government of India approved the XII Plan Scheme proposals of the Council containing two schemes viz.,
 - 1. Process Mechanization and Automation of Cashew Processing Units
 - 2. Quality up-gradation and Food Safety Certifications

The Scheme period will be from 2012-13 to 2016-17 with a grant component equivalent to 33.33% of the total eligible investment. The maximum total grant available for member exporter is Rs. 100 lakhs for Process Mechanization and Automation and Rs. 5 lakhs for Quality up-gradation and Food safety



- Certifications. For Associate members this would be Rs. 10 lakhs and Rs. 2.5 lakhs respectively.
- 14.3.3 20 claims were considered under the scheme and a grant in aid of Rs.1.17 Crs was sanctioned to member exporters. Against this, Rs. 18.28 Lakhs was released to 11 exporters on first-cum-first serve basis.

- 15.12 Chairman of the Council Mr. Shahal Hassan Musaliar and Joint Director Ms. Sree Rajmohan had meeting with Mr. Ajith B Chavan, Director, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry at Delhi on 27th January 2014, to discuss issues related to cashew industry
- 15.13 Honourable Minister of State (C& I) Dr. E.M. Sudarsana Natchiappan convened a performance review meeting on 28th January 2014 at Delhi to discuss various pending issues affecting the export performance of the sector. Chairman of the Council Mr.Shahal Hassan Musaliar and Joint Director, Ms. Sree Rajmohan represented the Council.



- 15.14 Council in association with Indian Bank (lead bank for Kollam) and Cashew Committee of Bankers, Kollam organized an Exporters Meet on 2nd January 2014 at Quilon Beach Hotel on banking related issues. 31 bankers attended the meeting. The meeting facilitated direct interaction with exporters and senior banking officials.
- A meeting of sub committee on cashew processing was convened by State Food Processing Mission (KINFRA) at District industries Centre ,Kollam on 27th January 2014, to undertake review of the cashew processing sector with respect to the requirements for eligibility to seek grant in aid under National Mission on Food Processing. Ms. Priya, Statistical Assistant attended the meeting.

16. TRADE ENQUIRIES

- 16.1. During 2013-2014 the Council received 112 (foreign 59 and Indian 53) trade enquiries directly from parties interested in cashew kernels/cashewnut shell liquid/ allied products and offers for supply of raw cashewnuts. All these enquiries and offers were circulated among the Council Members for necessary follow-up.
- 16.2. Trade enquiries received at the Council's stand in the international exhibitions were also passed on to the members for necessary action at their end.



17. PROBLEMS TAKEN UP WITH AUTHORITIES

- 17.1. Import of cashew kernels
- 17.1.1. The Indian cashew industry has been facing severe threats from mis-declared /undervalued cashew kernel imports flooding the domestic market. Such under-invoiced imports have not only been ruining our domestic cashew processing industry but also giving our competing countries advantage over us in the international market resulting in high revenue loss to the country.
- 17.1.2. To sort out this serious problem, Council had taken up this matter with concerned authorities viz. Ministry of Commerce and DGFT in various forums and we were able to convince the Government of India about the seriousness of the issue. Based on our request, the Govt. issued a notification (No. 27/2013 dated 10.05.2013) to increase the import duty of cashew kernels as Rs. 60/kg. or 45% (whichever is higher) for "cashew kernels broken" and Rs. 75/kg. or 45% (whichever is higher) for "cashew kernels wholes".
- 17.1.3. The minimum import price was also fixed to curtail the under invoiced imports. The DGFT vide notification (No. 53 (RE-2013)/2009 2014 dated 02.12.2013) set the minimum import price for import of cashew kernels as Rs. 288/= per kg. for "cashew kernels –broken and Rs. 400/= per kg. for "cashew kernels wholes".

17.2. Banking issues

17.2.1. Council took up various banking related issues brought to its notice by the members. Major issues taken up were the service tax charged by banks on foreign bank charges. Even though banks were directed to collect service tax on reverse mechanism, the banks are debiting the service tax to the exporting customers, which increased the burden of exporters.

17.3. FSSAI registration for raw cashewnuts and CNSL

- 17.3.1. When FSSAI registration has made compulsory for dealing food products, raw cashewnut an industrial raw material and Cashewnut Shell Liquid (CNSL) a by-product of cashew industry have been included under the products require FSSAI registration.
- 17.3.2. Council is pursuing this issue with the Ministry of Agriculture & Co-operation and also through Ministry of Commerce & Industry, to exempt raw cashewnuts and CNSL from the purview of FSSA since these are non edible items.

18. CEPC LABORATORY AND TECHNICAL DIVISION

- 18.1. The CEPC Laboratory & Technical Division was established in the year 1997 for providing analytical services mainly to the Indian cashew industry. The lab has facilities to analyse physical, chemical, and microbial parameters including pesticide residues, aflatoxin, heavy metals in cashew and allied products. The laboratory follows internationally accepted test methods for analysis. The services of this laboratory and technical division are available not only to cashew industry in India, but also to the entire food processing industry in India and abroad
- 18.2. The CEPC laboratory is an authentic agency for testing and certification of food quality and safety. The laboratory regularly participates in check sample/validation programmes organized by international/national agencies. The analytical and scientific expertise available with the lab is being extended to other educational, industrial and research organizations also.

19.1. Analytical Services

I) Routine analysis of Samples

During the period 2013-2014, **5773** Cashew kernels and other samples were analyzed in the laboratory and results submitted. During the period, the main sources of income of the laboratory was generated from the following activities.

19.5 NABL Accreditation

The Laboratory is accredited under ISO/IEC: 17025 by NABL (National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories), Department of Science & Technology, Government of India for "Biological and Chemical testing". Lab was maintained as per stipulations laid down by NABL. Internal audits were conducted as per schedule. The laboratory has also participated and conducted various inter laboratory comparison programmes.

19.6 BIS Recognition

The recognition granted to CEPC laboratory by the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) for the testing of Packaged Drinking Water, including pesticide residue as per IS 14543:2004 was maintained. The Surveillance Audit of the laboratory was conducted on 27^{th} & 28^{th} August, 2013 by BIS. The BIS Recognition Renewal Audit was conducted on 18^{th} & 19^{th} November, 2013. Twenty Packaged Drinking Water samples received from BIS were analysed and results furnished.

19.7 Approval from Kerala State Pollution Control Board

The laboratory is approved as 'A' grade Commercial Category laboratory for analysis of quality / pollution parameters for water / waste water and solid waste by the Kerala State Pollution Control Board (KSPCB). The approval was renewed and is valid till 23-06-2015.

19.8 University Recognitions

The laboratory is recognized as a Centre for Doctoral research under:

- a) Kannur University, in the subjects Microbiology, Biotechnology and Chemistry.
- b) University of Kerala in Biotechnology & Microbiology.

19.9 DSIR Recognition

The laboratory is granted recognition as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (SIRO) by the Department of Scientific & Industrial Research, Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India. The recognition is valid from 23-04-2013 upto 31-03-2016.

The workshop provided a good insight into the world of Biotechnology, Pharmacology and Biochemistry techniques. A total of 77 participants from different organizations including school students from various places, participated in the workshop.

The workshop included technical and practical sessions. Hands-on training for various sophisticated instruments and analytical techniques like – *HPTLC*, *PCR*, *RT-PCR*, *TGA*, *SDS-PAGE*, *Fermentor*, *UV-Vis-NIR Spectrophotometer*, *Phase Contrast Microscope* and *Enzyme Assays* etc. was provided to the participants. Experts (both in house and outside) handled Technical Sessions. An Exhibition on technologies developed under the NAIP Project was also arranged.

Certificates were issued to the participants and feedback recorded.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of THE CASHEW EXPORT PROMOTION COUNCIL OF INDIA, KOLLAM-691001, which comprise the Balance Sheet, as at 31st March 2014 and the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Responsibility of the Council's Management for the Financial Statements

Council's Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Council in accordance with the Accounting Standards referred to in Section 211(3C) of the Companies Act 1956 read with the General Circular 15/2013 dated 13th September 2013 of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs in respect of Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards of Auditing issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Council's preparation and fair presentation of financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the Council's Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Basis for Adverse opinion

a. Point no 1(d) of the Significant Accounting Policies states that the Council works on a no profit no loss basis. Trade contributions collected are treated as provisional and accounted as revenue only to the extent of the expenditure incurred by the council. Accordingly the surplus trade contribution collected during the year amounting to Rs. 53,83,288/- has been treated as liability and not as revenue. In our

opinion, the treatment of trade contribution collected as advance without treating the entire amount as revenue is not in accordance with Accounting Standard 9 - Revenue Recognition issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Had this amount been treated as revenue the statement of income and expenditure for the year would have shown an excess of income over expenditure of Rs. 53,83,288/-.

- b. As referred to in point no 2 of the Significant Accounting Policies, the council has not made any provision for the encashment of the earned leave for the employees as required by Accounting Standard 15 Employee Benefits issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The impact due to this on the accounts is not quantifiable.
- c. As referred to in point no 6 of Significant Accounting Policies foreign currency transactions are translated into Indian currency at the exchange rates at which the debits or credits are made by the bank and not at the exchange rate prevailing on the dates of the transactions as stipulated in Accounting Standard 11 Effect of Changes in Foreign Exchange Rates issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

Adverse Opinion

In our opinion, because of the significance of the matters discussed in the Basis for Adverse Opinion paragraph, the financial statements do not give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- a) In case of the Balance Sheet, of the statement of affairs of the Council as at March 31, 2014;
- b) In the case of the statement of Income and Expenditure of the Council of Nil profit/loss for the year ended on that date.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- 1. As this company is registered under section 25 of The Companies Act of 1956 the provisions of the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2003 as amended by the Companies (Auditor's Report) (Amendment) Order, 2004 issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub-section (4A) of section 227 of the Companies Act, 1956, are not applicable to this Company.
- 2. As required by Section 227(3) of the Act, we report that
- a. We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit except for the matters described in the Basis for Adverse Opinion paragraph.
- b. In our opinion proper books of accounts as required by law have been kept by the Council so far as appears from our examination of those books.
- c. The Balance Sheet and Statement of Income and Expenditure dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- d. Except for the possible effects of the matters described in the Basis for Adverse Opinion paragraph, in our opinion, the balance sheet, Statement of Income and Expenditure comply with the accounting standards referred to in sub section (3C) of section 211 of the Companies Act 1956, read with the General Circular 15/2013 dated 13th September 2013 of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs in respect of section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Revenue Recognition

- a) The Council follows accrual system of accounting based on historical cost concept in relation to its income and expenditure except subscription to the council's publications, sale of publications and fees from training course conducted at CEPC Lab at Kollam.
- b) Full amount of entrance fee is taken as income of the Council as was done in the previous year.
- c) As regards house building /vehicle advance are concerned, the repayment is first appropriated to principal and then to interest.
- d) The Council is an organization working on "No Profit- No Loss" basis. The trade contribution for the year is collected purely on a provisional advance basis and added to the advance contribution carried over from the previous year. The trade contribution required for a year is taken from gross amount and the balance is carried over to the next year

2. Retirement benefit

Contribution to recognized Provident Fund Scheme, which is, defined contribution scheme is charged to profit and loss account. The above scheme is treated as defined contribution plan since the council has no further obligation beyond making the contributions

The Council is covered under Group Gratuity Scheme of Life Insurance Corporation of India for future payments of gratuity as determined on actuarial basis by Life Insurance Corporation of India. The Contribution for the year is charged to statement of Income and Expenditure. The shortfall in the fund compared to gratuity liability arrived at on actuarial basis by LIC is provided for every year.

No provision is made for the leave encashment liability.

3. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets disclosed in the accounts are stated at historical cost and reduced by depreciation till date. All cost relating to the acquisition and installation of fixed assets have been capitalized.

4. Depreciation

In respect of all assets depreciation has been charged to revenue account on the cost/WDV of assets at the rate prescribed in the schedule XIV to the companies act, 1956 and on addition pro-rata basis.

5. Inventories

Stocks of chemicals and controlled items have been valued at lower of cost or market price.

6. Foreign Exchange (AS 11)

Transactions in foreign exchange have been translated at the exchange rates at which the expenditure / receipts have actually taken place by debit or credit to the bank accounts.



Government Grants

Grant relating to the depreciable fixed assets has been treated as deferred income and is recognized in the Income and Expenditure account on a systematic and rational basis over the useful life of the assets in proportion in which depreciation on the assets is charged as per Accounting Standard-12 issued by ICAI.

Grant related to revenue is recognized on a systematic basis in the Income and Expenditure Account of the year necessary to match them with related cost of which the grant is intended to compensate.

Contingent Liability

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements. The Contingent Liabilities, if material, are disclosed by way of notes.

9. Deferred Tax

As the Council is a no-profit -no-loss organization registered under Section 25 of the Companies Act 1956, it is not assessed to tax. Hence, the deferred Tax asset/liability as stipulated in AS-22- Accounting for Taxes, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India is not applicable to the council.
